### All of ME

## Ethnic minority youth speaks out against stereotypes through photo exhibition

(Hong Kong, 22 January 2016) – KELY Support Group (KELY) proudly presents *All of ME* – a photo exhibition representing 35 Hong Kong's ethnic minority youth's sense of self, experience of life and stereotypes.

**All of ME** is a highly personal and honest portrayal into the identities of ethnic minority youth in Hong Kong: how people perceive them, versus who they really are. Exhibiting 54 photographs, **All of ME** gave a rare opportunity for young people from ethnic minority backgrounds - 35 participants from KELY's **Moody's RiseUp** programme - to speak up: on discrimination, self-identity, confidence, friendships, loneliness, emotional wellbeing and fears – the systemic barriers and discrimination that are often faced by the ethnic minorities in Hong Kong. <sup>1</sup>

Developed by KELY and funded by **The Moody's Foundation**, *Moody's RiseUp* is a youth development initiative which aims to help Hong Kong's ethnic minority youth build resilience and life skills to increase access to socioeconomic capitals. Youth participants are encouraged to see different perspectives and express their own life experience in Hong Kong through a creative medium. Since April 2015, *Moody's RiseUp* has provided 35 students, aged 15 to 17, **from St. Margaret's Girls' College, Hong Kong** an opportunity to explore important life goals through group mentorship, while exploring self-identity and awareness through developing technical skills in photography.

**Non-Chinese Speaking** - Youth suffering from low self-esteem who may be facing drugs and/or alcohol abuse and issues relating to discrimination or integration, and may not be receiving culturally relevant support services.
